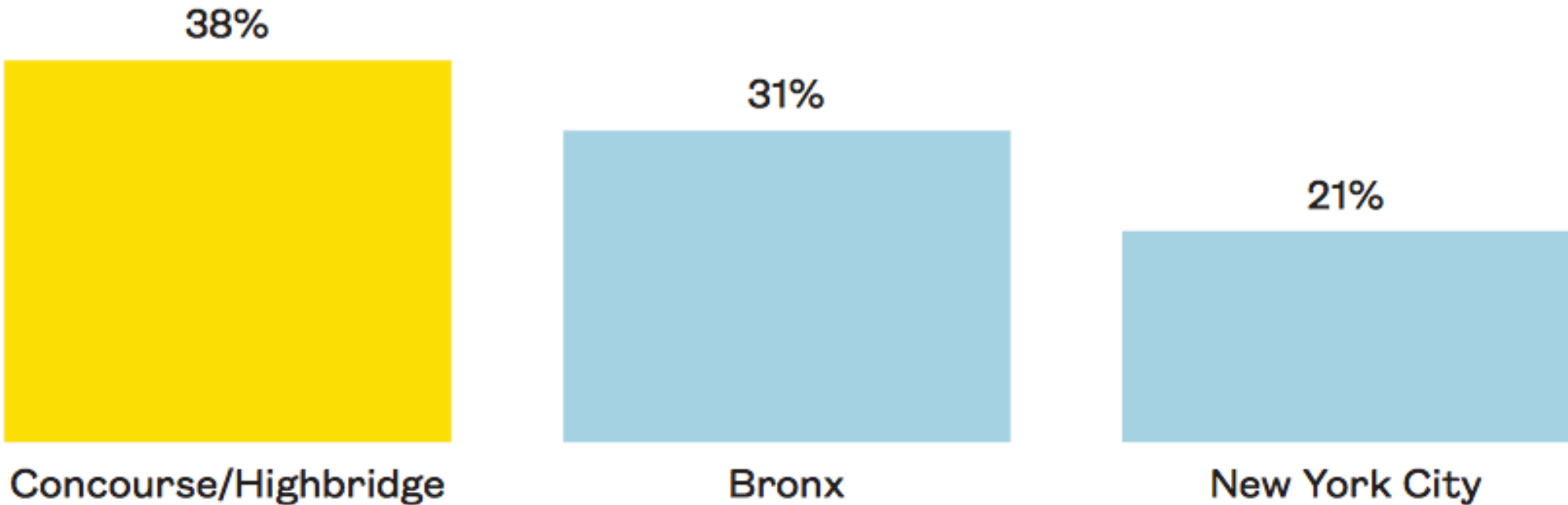

2013



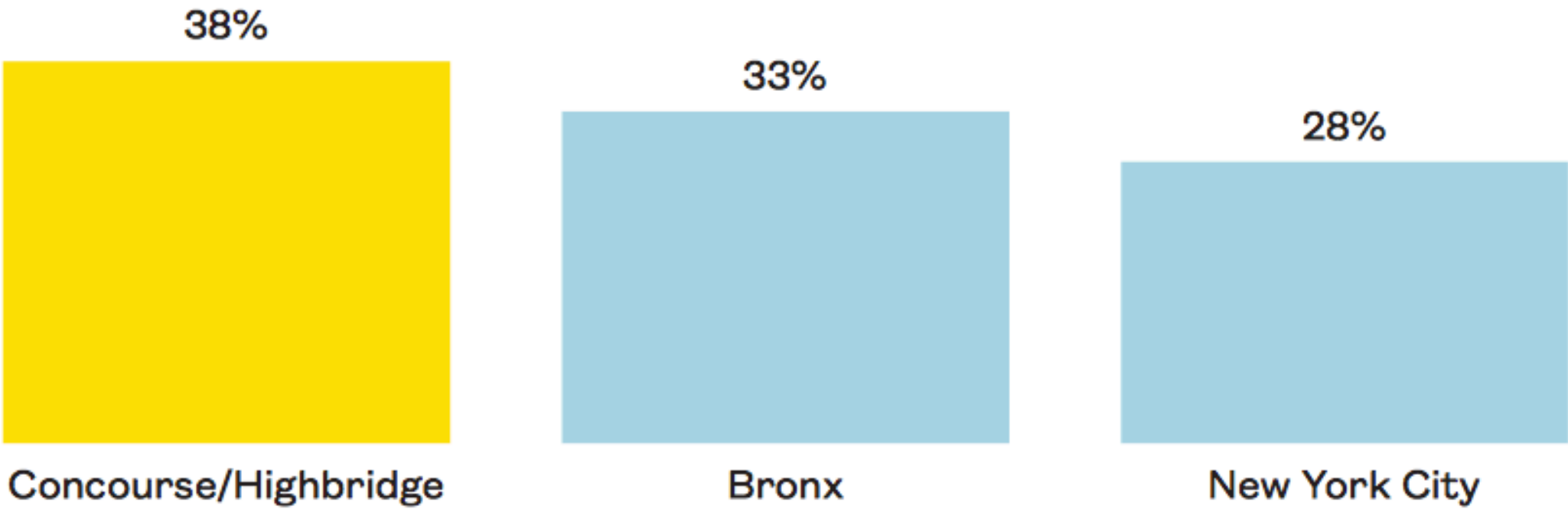

Note: Households that are severely rent burdened are defined as those whose gross rent is 50 percent or more of their income.

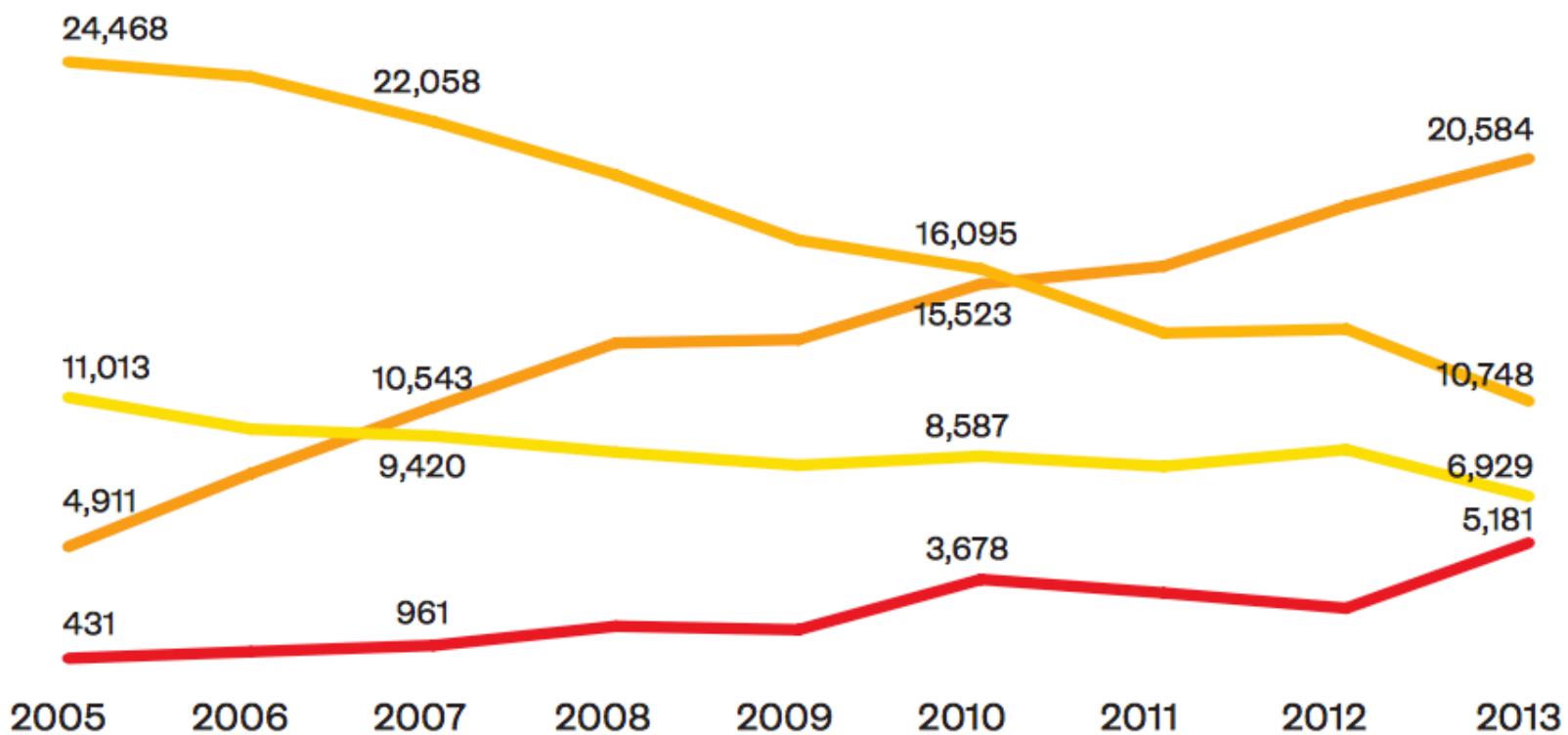

Note: Rental units without cash rent are not included in chart.

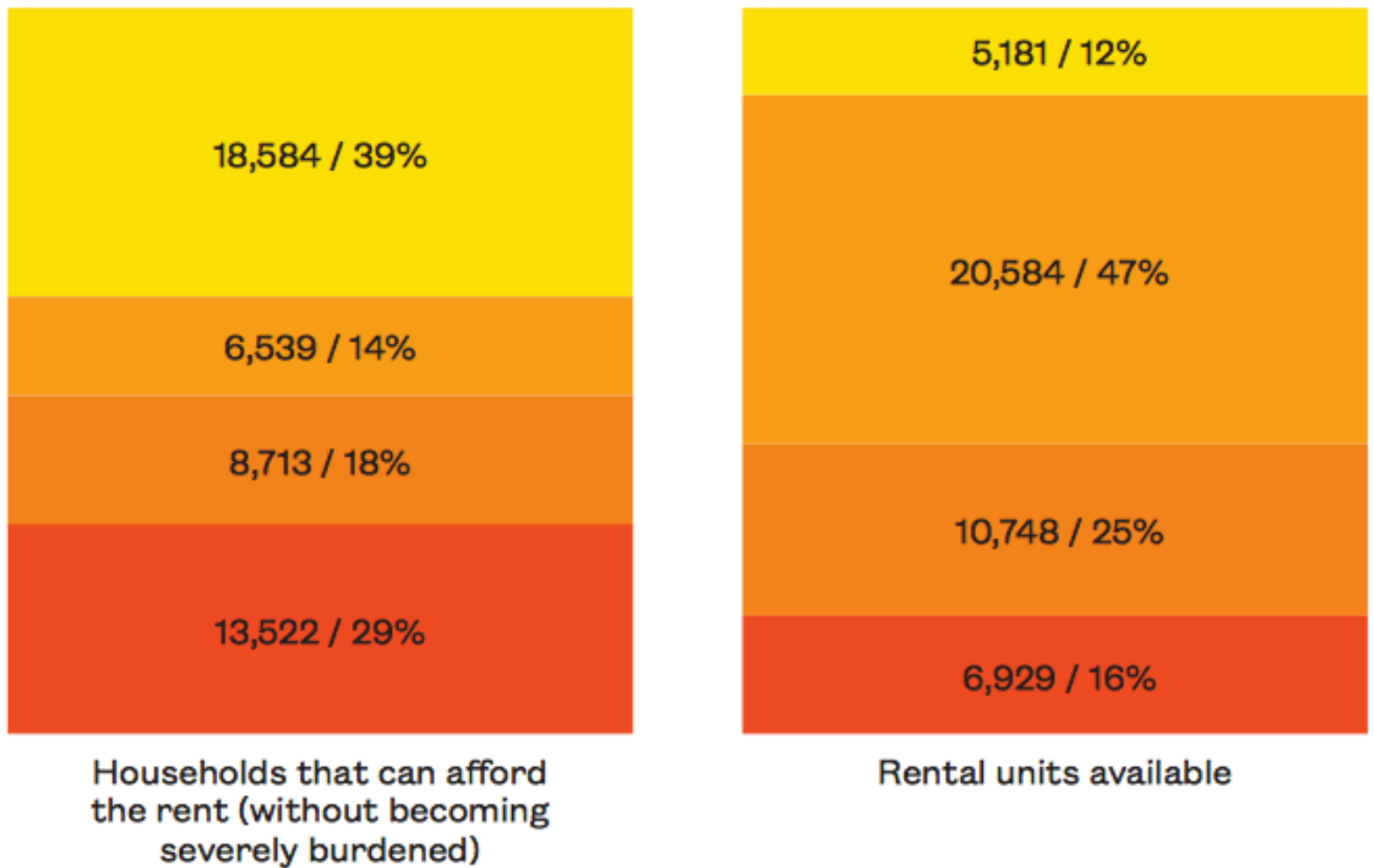

Note: Figures show the number of households who can afford the approximate rents by paying 50% or less of their income. Rental units without cash rent are not included in chart.

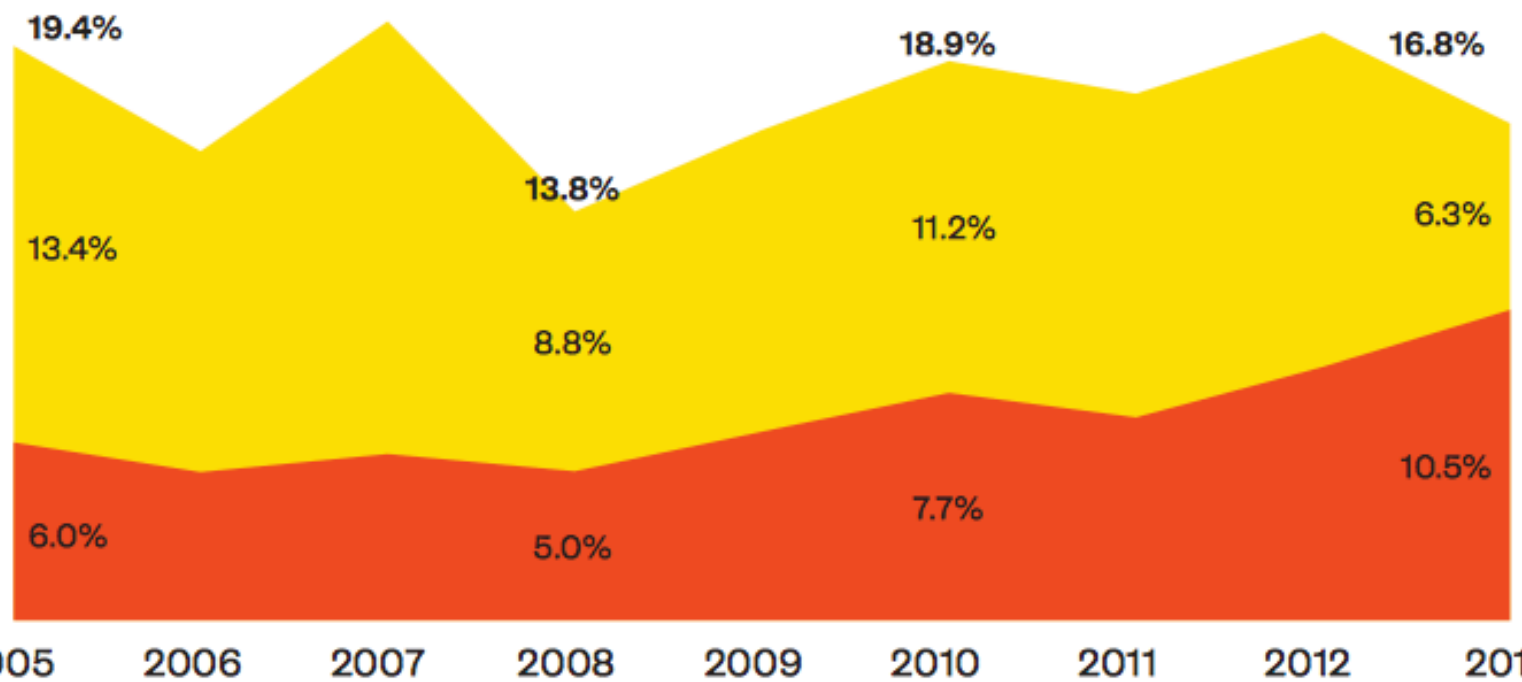

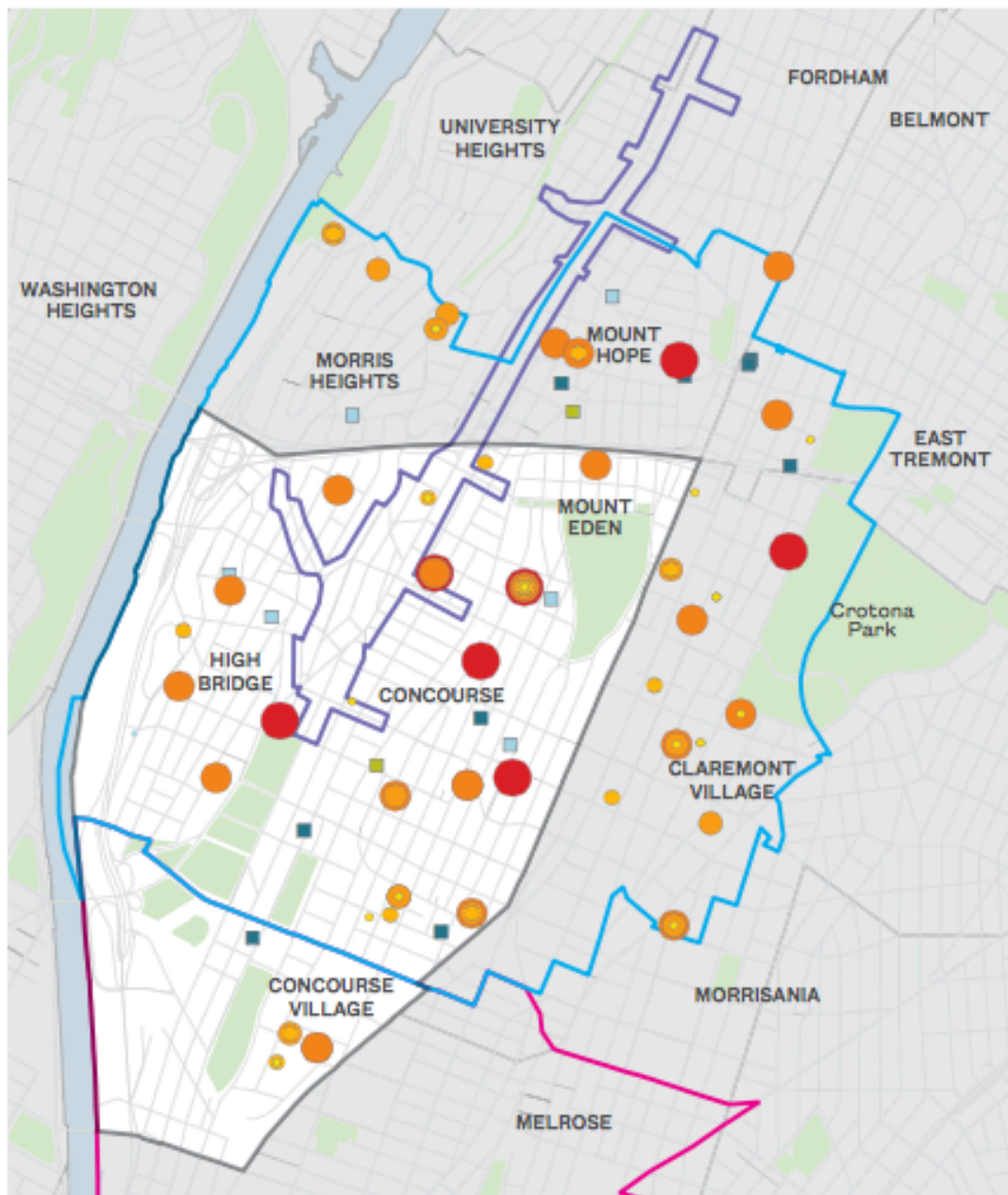
