Key Findings

Roughly 2,750 doubled-up homeless students and 165 students in shelter attended District 20 schools. These District 20 students scored proficient at higher rates than doubled-up and sheltered students citvwide.

Students in shelter attending District 20 schools were suspended at a rate of 9.0%, compared to 2.5% citywide.


