

### Beyond housing, make the invisible, visible





I was sleeping on the streets before I got arrested, sleeping in a bus station or in motels when I could. I took drugs not to think about. Not to think about the fact that I might not have somewhere to stay, that I might have to sleep on the street. I'm ashamed of it.

I just wanted stability. I didn't have anything stable, anywhere stable to live. I just wanted stability.

**Voices of Youth Count** is an national, mixed-methods research and policy initiative linking evidence to action to end youth homelessness.



















#### A broad & hidden challenge

1 in 10

young adults ages 18 to 25 endures some form of homelessness in a year. Half of the prevalence involves couch surfing only.

1 in 30

adolescent minors ages 13 to 17 endures some form of homelessness in a year. A quarter of the prevalence involves couch surfing only.

Rates of youth experiencing homelessness were similar in rural and nonrural areas.




#### Rural youth homelessness is especially hidden

are pregnant or a parent




have a pregnant partner or are a parent


### Youth of color experience higher rates of homelessness.





#### Disproportionality & intersectionality


Explicit homelessness over the last 12 months, self-reported by young adults, ages 18-25. These estimates do not include reports of couch surfing only.

[T]he best intervention will be breaking the cycle... [I]t ends up costing you more money to whoever's funding or however it's being funded if you don't... solve a problem now. So I think it takes actually listening to us and what we're seeing...


#### A comprehensive approach



Define the problem • Identify causes, risk & protective factors • Develop & test interventions Scale-up evidence-based solutions • Monitor implementation



#### Age of first homelessness among 19-25-year-olds



1 in 4 youth interviewed in 5 communities had prior experiences of family homelessness or housing instability

#### The relationship between educational attainment and homelessness is bidirectional.

Low educational attainment is a risk factor for homelessness\*....



Young adults with less than a high school diploma or GED were

4.5x

more likely to report experiencing homelessness than their peers who completed high school.

...and homelessness is a risk factor for lower educational attainment.




Young adults who experienced homelessness were less than

1/3

as likely to be enrolled in four-year college as stably housed peers.













